- We are attaching, herewith, a transcript of our diary for August, 1957, and our reason for so doing is two-fold. is to show the urgent need for some assistance, and the second is to request that, in the event of continued delay in making a Grade One appointment, your Office declare a priority on the branch of our work you consider most important.
- There are three special SII cases pending, and requests are on hand from twelve other points for investigations. more than enough to keep one man busy for the balance of the year.
- Following the Department's negotiations with the B. C. Power Commission, six men, with full equipment, have been assigned to clearing up of faults on their transmission lines. started at Kamloops, through Lumby, and are now in the Arrow Lakes district, working on some 36 miles of line from Nakusp to Whatshan. From there they will go through to the Columbia Valley. the costs involved for a return trip, this office has been requested to check on the results of their work before they leave each This request is reasonable under the circumstances, but will put an added load on us for the next month or so, as they move East.
- For examinations, we request applicants who live within 100 miles of Kelowna to appear here. Applicants from points further away are asked to be ready when we call. Our movements have been so erratic that it is difficult to set dates in either event for such examinations; consequently, our list of applicants is growing.
- 5. Our inspection total is down from last year, with a higher percentage of licencees. We know there are infractions, such as many regatta committees throughout the interior (excepting Kelowna),

who seem to have radio communication available. More time should be available for this section of our work.

- 6. It is also obvious to both offices that more time should be spent on the preparation of applications and reports, and also on public demands on this office.
- 7. In conclusion, it would seem that, in view of the volume of work-load, and the lack of time and staff to handle it properly, instructions such as suggested in paragraph (1) should be supplied by your office. We therefore submit the foregoing for your further discussion and consideration.
